

### IN MEMORIAM – YANINA MURIN-DIEZ

Yanina Murin-Diez passed away peacefully at her home in Pierrefonds, Quebec, on November 30, 1991, aged forty-nine years. She was born in Bratislava, Slovakia, November 14, 1942, a daughter of Charles and Isabel Murin. Ms. Diez was the wife of Anselmo C. Diez.

For several years, Ms. Diez was a popular sessional lecturer in the Department of Educational Psychology and Counselling, McGill University, where she taught Career Psychology. She was co-founder of Orientation Individuelle, a private counselling service, in Dorval, Quebec, and had taught for several years part-time at John Abbott College. Ms. Diez was well-known for her work as a psychiatric nurse-therapist in Montreal, Puerto Rico, and Madrid. She received her B.A. degree at Loyola College (Montreal), an R.N. from Université de Montréal, and the M.Ed. from McGill University. She had completed a major part of her studies for the Ph.D. in Counselling Psychology at McGill when she became ill.

In addition to her studies and professional accomplishments, Ms. Diez was a certified translator of French, English, Spanish, and Slovak. She was a member of the Quebec Order of Nurses and the *Corporation professionnelle des conseillers et conseillères d'orientation du Québec*. In 1989-1990, she served as vice-president and secretary for the organizing committee of an international conference, Association internationale d'orientation scolaire et professionnelle (AIOSP), held in Montreal, August 13-17, 1990.

Funeral services were held on December 3, 1991, at the Slovak Catholic Church, on Jean-Talon East (in Montreal).

She will be greatly missed by her former students and colleagues.
